In this week's Gospel, Jesus tells a story about a man who owned some land. The man planted some grapes on the land and then rented it to some other men to take care of it for him while he was away. When it came time to harvest the crop, the landowner sent some of his servants to collect his share of the harvest. The men who had leased the land beat the man's servants and even killed one of them. They refused to give the landowner what was due him. The second time the landowner sent his servants to collect what was due to him, the servants were treated the same way. Finally, the landowner sent his own son to the tenants. He thought surely they would listen to his own son. But when they saw the son, they said, "This is the landowner's son, let's kill him and take his inheritance." In this story, the landowner was God. God first sent men such as Noah, Moses, David, the prophet Isaiah, and others to tell the people of his love for them and to call them to turn from their wicked ways, but many would not listen. Finally, he sent His own Son, Jesus. God gave them a chance. He even gave them a second chance - and a third. But when they rejected His Son, that was their last chance. Jesus is our last chance too - it is only through Him that we can lead lives full of God's love and goodness!
