At the time when Jesus lived, there was no electricity. When darkness fell, people relied on clay lamps filled with oil to provide them with light. If you were unprepared to top up the lamp with oil, then once the oil ran out you were left in the darkness and unable to see. Jesus tells a story about the importance of being prepared! In his Parable of the Ten Bridesmaids, Jesus said ten bridesmaids took their oil lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. They didn't know when he would come, or how long they would have to wait. Five of them were foolish because they didn't bring any extra oil to put in their lamps. When it was time to go out and meet the bridegroom, they were out of oil. The other five were very wise and well-prepared. They had brought plenty of oil for their lamps. When it was time to go out and meet the bridegroom, they were ready. In this story, the bridegroom is Jesus and you and I are the bridesmaids. The story is teaching us that one day we are going to go to meet Jesus. It teaches us that we must be prepared, because we don't know exactly when that time is coming.


Our Current Virtue to Live By is Prayer
